

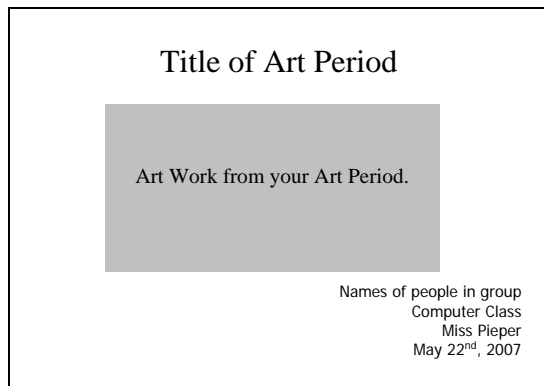
6th Grade Art History Group Slide Presentation

Due Tuesday, May 22nd

YOU MAY NEED TO MEET OUTSIDE OF COMPUTER CLASS TO COMPARE AND ORGANIZE YOUR GROUPS' NOTES AND PREPARE FOR THE PRESENTATION !!!!!!!!!!!!!!!

Using StarOffice Presentation compile your group's information into a slide presentation.

1. REVIEW YOUR ORIGINAL handout I gave each of you for questions you needed to answer for your art history period, and make sure all sections/questions are answered adequately throughout everyone's outlines. I will especially be looking at the CHARACTERISTIC/STYLE section.
- 2.) Divide the outline sections out EVENLY to each group member. **EVERY group member will be (graded) responsible for and working on and presenting the CHARACTERISTICS, CONCLUSION, and BIBLIOGRAPHY slides!!!**
 - If one person has more slides to do and another person had fewer slides to do, grades will reflect this difference in responsibility.
- 3.) Cut apart everyone's outline and give the same sections to the person working on that section. Staple each section together. You will be graded on YOUR sections' slide design and verbal presentation of your sections. See grading sheet on back!)
- 4.) Lay out slides in order of the OUTLINES you all did.
 - Each question/section should have 1-3 slides telling me that information.
 - Each new sub-topic should be a new slide.
 - Order of slides:
 - Title Slide
(format to the right)



- Introduction Slide
 - Three words that describe your art styles, and names of the artists
 - **SPECIFIC SECTION ORDER from YOUR HANDOUT/OUTLINES**
 - Conclusion
 - What do each of you think about your art period – likes, dislikes
(DON'T tell me how you like the project, but the art period art)
 - Bibliography Slide – All books/sites used, proper format
- 5.) Each slide should be specifically labeled on the title bar telling me **WHO MADE THAT SLIDE.**
 - 6.) Each slide should have 1- 3 pictures dealing specifically with the information on that slide.
 - Each and every picture should be labeled with a caption.
 - *Examples: art from that art period, a picture of the artist, a piece of art work from that specific artist, a map showing the area of you culture or where the art period began...*

- If it is a picture of the artist, then the artists FULL NAME
- If it is a picture of a piece of art work or building, then you need to tell me the ARTIST'S NAME and the TITLE of the picture

7.) Slide Format – Each Slide NEEDS TO/WILL BE GRADED ON:

- DO NOT TYPE THE QUESTION FROM THE HANDOUT AND THEN PROCEED TO ANSWER IT.
- Each slide should have a title on the top for that specific information.
- All information needs to be typed in complete, understandable bullet format (discussed in class).
- Have at least 1 - 3 pictures related to the information on that page.
- ALL pictures need a caption box underneath them telling us what the picture is. If it is an art work you need - **ARTIST and TITLE**.
- To make your presentation look all the same, your group needs to use the same background, the same size font, and the same type of font.
(Titles should be 50 point font and text information 20 point font)
- Layout of each slide (title, text and pictures) need to be interesting and pleasing and **EASY to see and READ**.
- Bibliography slide – Formatted Properly
- CORRECT INFORMATION – talk to each other about your information, some people DO NOT have the correct information.
- ALL QUESTIONS NEED TO BE ANSWERED!!!!!!!
- DO NOT REPEAT INFORMATION!!!!
- **SPELLING-GRAMMAR....PROOF YOUR PRESENTATION-USE SPELL CHECK**
- **Finished and professional presentations**

8.) Presentation Grade: **Presentations begin on Thursday, May 24th**

- You will be presenting and graded on the slides you made and were responsible for.
 - EVERYONE is presenting the Conclusions slide
 - NO ONE presents the Bibliography Page. Will just be up at the end when I ask you your questions.
- You **NEED** to know your facts. I may ask you to repeat a fact at the end of the presentation and you will need to know the answer. Your classmates can ask questions also.
- You **CAN NOT** read the slide. Have note cards to refer to while presenting, but **YOU** should **KNOW** your information and **LOOK AT THE CLASS** while presenting. May point to pictures when explaining them.
- Slide should be in proper order and **GROUP** needs to know when each person is presenting. Good flow between partners is required.
- Need to think about your speech before hand and present professionally.
If you need to print out your slides to prepare at home with your group or by yourself, you may do so.

NOTE: You will be e-mailing me your FINISHED presentation on TUESDAY, MAY 22nd.

NOTE: Presentations begin on THURSDAY, MAY 24th. I will draw groups randomly out of a hat. If YOU are not ready to present when I call your group, you will lose 15% on your grade and everyone in your group will lose 5%.
